Baldacci, David. *The Fix*. Special Agent Amos Decker witnesses a murder just outside FBI headquarters. A man shoots a woman execution-style on a crowded sidewalk, then turns the gun on himself.

Berry, Steve. *The Lost Order*. The Knights of the Golden Circle was a dangerous clandestine organization in American history that amassed billions of valuables, all buried in hidden caches across the U.S. Two factions of what remains want that lost treasure—one to spend it for their own ends, the other to preserve it.

Brown, Sandra. *Deadline*. Dawson, a traumatized war journalist, is covering the disappearance and presumed murder of former Marine Jeremy Wesson, the biological son of the pair of terrorists who remain on the FBI's Most Wanted list.

Clark, Mary Higgins. *All By Myself Alone*. A glamorous cruise on a luxurious ocean liner turns deadly.

Brown, Dale. *Price of Duty*. The U.S. and its Western allies come under a diabolical Russian cyber warfare attack in this action-packed military techno-thriller.

Child, Lincoln. *Full Wolf Moon*. Child is back with a new thriller featuring Jeremy Logan, the renowned investigator of the supernatural and fantastic, who follows the trail of a killer who cannot exist.
